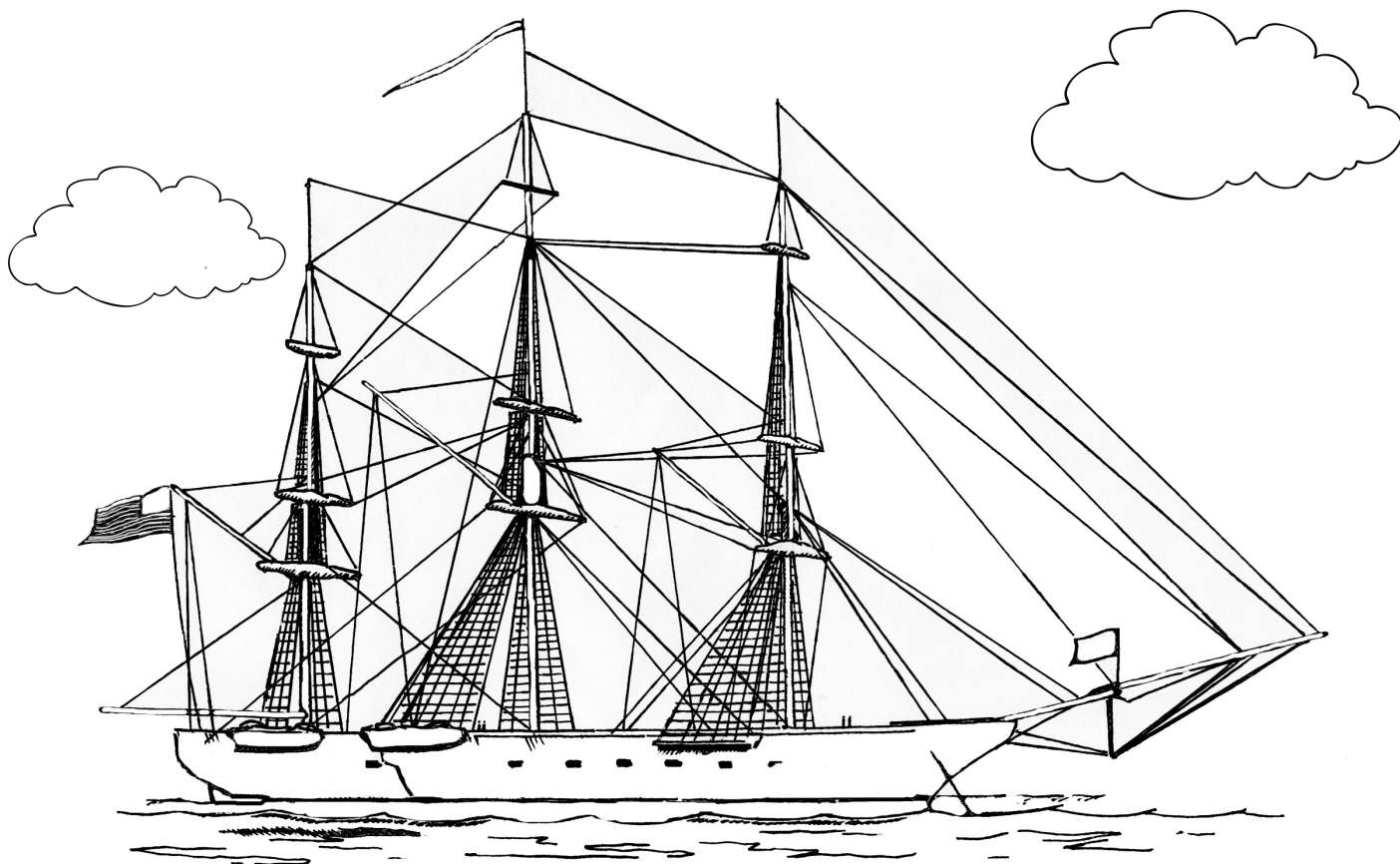


U.S.S. SAVANNAH

SLOOP OF WAR



USS SAVANNAH began her career in 1842, as a frigate and served as the flagship of the Pacific Squadron during the U.S. Mexican War. She aided the Squadron in capturing the city of Monterey, California in 1846. In 1857, she was converted to a 24-gun sloop of war. In 1861, during the Civil War, SAVANNAH was stationed off the coast of Georgia and helped capture two Confederate vessels. In 1862, SAVANNAH was taken out of active duty and served as an instruction ship for the U.S. Naval Academy until 1870. She was sold to the E. Stannard and Company in 1883.
